Denmaur Independent Papers Ltd is committed to the principles promoted by the Forest Stewardship Council® and the Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification of environmentally appropriate, socially beneficial and economically viable management of forests.

We explicitly agree currently, and in the future, not to directly or indirectly involve in the following unacceptable activities: -

- Illegal logging or the trade in illegal wood or forest products;
- Violation of traditional and human rights in forestry operations;
- Destruction of high conservation values in forest operations;
- Significant conversion of forest to plantations or non-forest use;
- Introduction of genetically modified organisms in forest operations:
- Violation of any of the ILO Core Conventions as defined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work

In the event of substantiated claims regarding the legality of our products, we will not place those products on the market until the concerns raised have been investigated and resolved.

The Directors and management team of Denmaur Independent Papers Ltd are fully committed to meeting the company's responsibilities and statutory requirements for ensuring high standards of health, safety and welfare of its employees, as well as others who may come into contact with, or be affected by, its operations.
